MASTER'S IN HEALTH AND WELFARE 120 CREDITS

In the multidisciplinary field of Health and Welfare several different professions from different subjects interact. As a student you will acquire profound knowledge with focus on multidisciplinary research. This programme will prepare you for a challenging and successful career in the health and welfare sector.

THE MASTER'S PROGRAMME in Health and Welfare gives you a broad understanding of the evolution and challenges of the health and welfare sector in times of globalisation. You will develop an understanding of management, teams and organisations, evidence-based practice and evaluation. In addition to the mandatory courses you choose courses within your preferred topic in one of the orientations of the programme: Social Work, Caring Science with specialisation in Nursing or Work Life Studies (read more on the next page). The objectives of the courses in scientific methods as well as of the independent thesis are for you to gain further and in-depth knowledge of research designs and methods and their applications in health and welfare.

You will study individually, discuss the course content in seminars and also work in groups with other students. You will develop your ability to exchange, critically approach and appraise knowledge and research at a scientific level.

For the award of a Master's degree you must complete a degree project of at least 30 credits or two such projects of at least 15 credits,

each within one of the orientations. The programme is organised on a two-year basis with the possibility to terminate after one year, obtaining a one-year Master's degree.

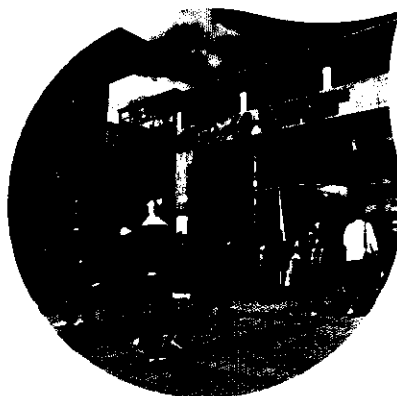
THE KNOWLEDGE ACQUIRED through this programme will improve your current or forthcoming work in the growing international health and welfare sector. A profound knowledge of this sector will also be a key component in all future careers involving the promotion of health and well-being – nationally and internationally. After completion of the programme you will fulfil the necessary entry requirements for doctoral studies within the area of Health and Welfare at Mälardalen University.

THREE ORIENTATIONS

The Master's programme in Health and Welfare offers several orientations to choose from which will lead to the degree of Master of Science, 120 credits, in Social Work, Caring Science with specialisation in Nursing or in Work Life Studies.

■ SOCIAL WORK

This orientation is focused on the study and understanding of social problems and special needs that shape the situation for individuals and groups. It involves studies of people of all ages and their life situations, living conditions and participation. The understanding of social issues draws upon system, power and rights perspectives, and the analysis is often intersectional. The aim of the orientation is to develop a practical understanding of problem-solving and processes of change for people in socially vulnerable situations.

The courses provide a thorough understanding of the challenges of multicultural society to social work and of how children's and young persons' rights can be promoted. They also provide in-depth knowledge of the social structural conditions that lie behind vulnerability and the changing needs of social support and care in course of life.

The courses in Social Work during the first year:

- Multicultural Social Work (7.5 credits)
- Social Work with Children (7.5 credits)

The courses in Social Work during the second year:

- Social Problems and Social Change Management at Different Levels (7.5 credits)
- Social Support and Care in Everyday Life (7.5 credits)

■ CARING SCIENCE WITH SPECIALISATION IN NURSING

This orientation has its base in nurses' core competencies and professional areas of responsibility. The patient and family in the context of care throughout the life cycle are in focus. Equity and access are emphasised, in a person-centred and collaborative approach, involving relations both between care-providers and patients and the family, and within the wider society. The orientation aims at understanding how different disciplines can collaborate in nursing research to answer questions in a broader perspective.

The courses provide in-depth knowledge of the theoretical perspectives on caring work and of competencies such as team work, health informatics and improvement of care. They also provide insight into the meaning of health and care for patients and families in complex caring contexts.

The courses in Caring Science during the first year:

- Theories and Concepts in Caring/ Nursing Science (7.5 credits)
- Caring Perspectives on Core Competences in Nursing (7.5 credits)

The course in Caring Science during the second year:

- The Patient and the Family in a Caring Context (15 credits)

■ WORK LIFE STUDIES

This orientation provides a broad and profound perspective on work in the health and welfare sector. The interdisciplinary field of Work Life Studies at Mälardalen University is made up of the disciplines of Sociology, Economics, Public Health and Psychology. They all provide important contributions to the understanding of work at the societal, organisational, group and individual levels.

The courses convey a thorough understanding of the welfare sector in a historical and global perspective and of the contemporary perspectives on organisational and leadership development. They also present in-depth knowledge of health and occupational problems, practical knowledge of health-promoting leadership and health-related interventions at the workplace. Furthermore they expand and deepen the understanding of the general scientific field of Working Life Science.

The courses in Work Life Studies during the first year:

- Work and Health (7.5 credits)
- Work and Organisation (7.5 credits)

The course in Work Life studies during the second year:

- Working Life Studies as a Scientific Field (15 credits)
